

4. Highlight of the week

considering the COVID19 Epidemiological situation the cabinet reviewed measures on Monday May 31st 2021: From 1st June, the following measures will be in place across Rwanda, and reviewed after one month:

- Movements are prohibited between 10 pm
 4 am
- Movements are prohibited between 7 pm 4 am in Karongi district
- Movements between Kigali and other provinces and between districts of the country will continue
- Physical meetings will continue not exceeding 30% of venue capacity. COVID 19 testing is required for meetings of more than 20 people.
- Public offices will continue with essential staff at no more than 50% capacity while other employees continue working from home on a rotational basis

• Private businesses will continue with essential staff at no more than 50% capacity while other employees continue working from home on a rotational basis. Markets and malls will continue for essential vendors and must not exceed 50% of registered traders.

- All businesses must close by 9 pm.
- All schools (public and private), including universities, shall resume.
- Public transport (buses) should not exceed 75% capacity. Bus operators will ensure passengers maintain social distancing and only passengers with masks will be allowed on board.
- Motos and bicycles are permitted to carry passengers and must observe strict hygiene.
- Restaurants and cafés shall operate at a 50% occupancy limit and shall receive clients until 9pm.
- All bars will remain closed.
- Places of worship adhering to



health guidelines will continue to function at 50% maximum occupancy.

• Tourism activity will continue in strict adherence with COVID – 19 health guidelines. This includes hotels, tour operators and transport services facilitating guests. Gyms will be allowed to resume activities on a gradual basis. A detailed reopening schedule will be communicated after readiness assessment, conducted by the Ministry of Sports.

• Outdoor sports will be allowed and must comply with health preventive measures. The Ministry of Sports will provide detailed guidelines.

• All swimming pools and spas are closed except for those at hotels hosting tested guests.

• Attendance at a wake/vigil (Ikiriyo) should not exceed 10 persons at any one time. Funeral gatherings should not exceed 30 persons.


• Civil and religious weddings should not exceed 30 persons.

• Traditional weddings and related receptions shall resume not exceeding 30 persons. However, when conducted in hotels/ entertainment venues or open gardens they should not exceed 30% of venue capacity and COVID-19 testing will be required. The Ministry of Local Government will provide detailed guidelines.


• Gaming operators shall resume activities gradually, upon fulfilling COVID-19 preventive measures. The Ministry of Trade and Industry will provide details guidelines.
