






5. Weekly focus: COVID-19 November 2021 insight in Rwanda

There was a remarkable decrease in number of COVID19 positive cases and deaths compared to previous months, the number of cases were 651 compared to 2,182 cases in October, while the number of deaths also decreased from 58 in October to 11 in November 2021 this decrease in morbidity and mortality due to COVID19 is mainly attributed to ongoing increased in vaccination coverage rate countrywide the number of vaccinated people with at least one dose is 5,987,745 as of 30th November 2021 while the number of Rwandan who received at two doses were 3,452,598.

In November the third dose is being administered to elderly people as well as people at high risk of reduced immunity such as those with chronic diseases.

Since the declaration Omicron in some of African countries there was an increased vigilance in surveillance at points entry as of now all passengers travelling from or those with a recent history of travel in particularly affected countries will be guarantined in hotels for 7 days.

The graph below shows the monthly trend in number of COVID19 cases.

As shown in the graph 3 the number of cases remarkably decreased in November 2021 compared to previous months, Vaccination and tightening of Public Health and Social Measures (PHSMs) in previous months are key factors contributing to this remarkable decrease.
