












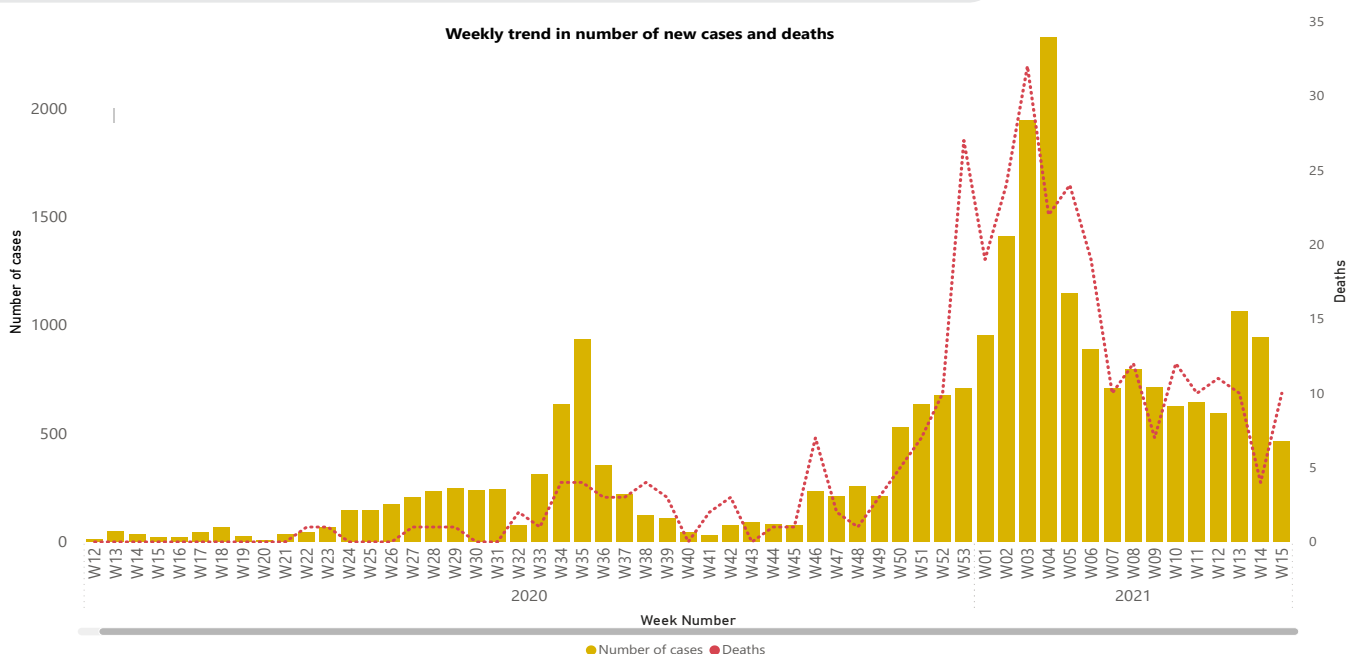

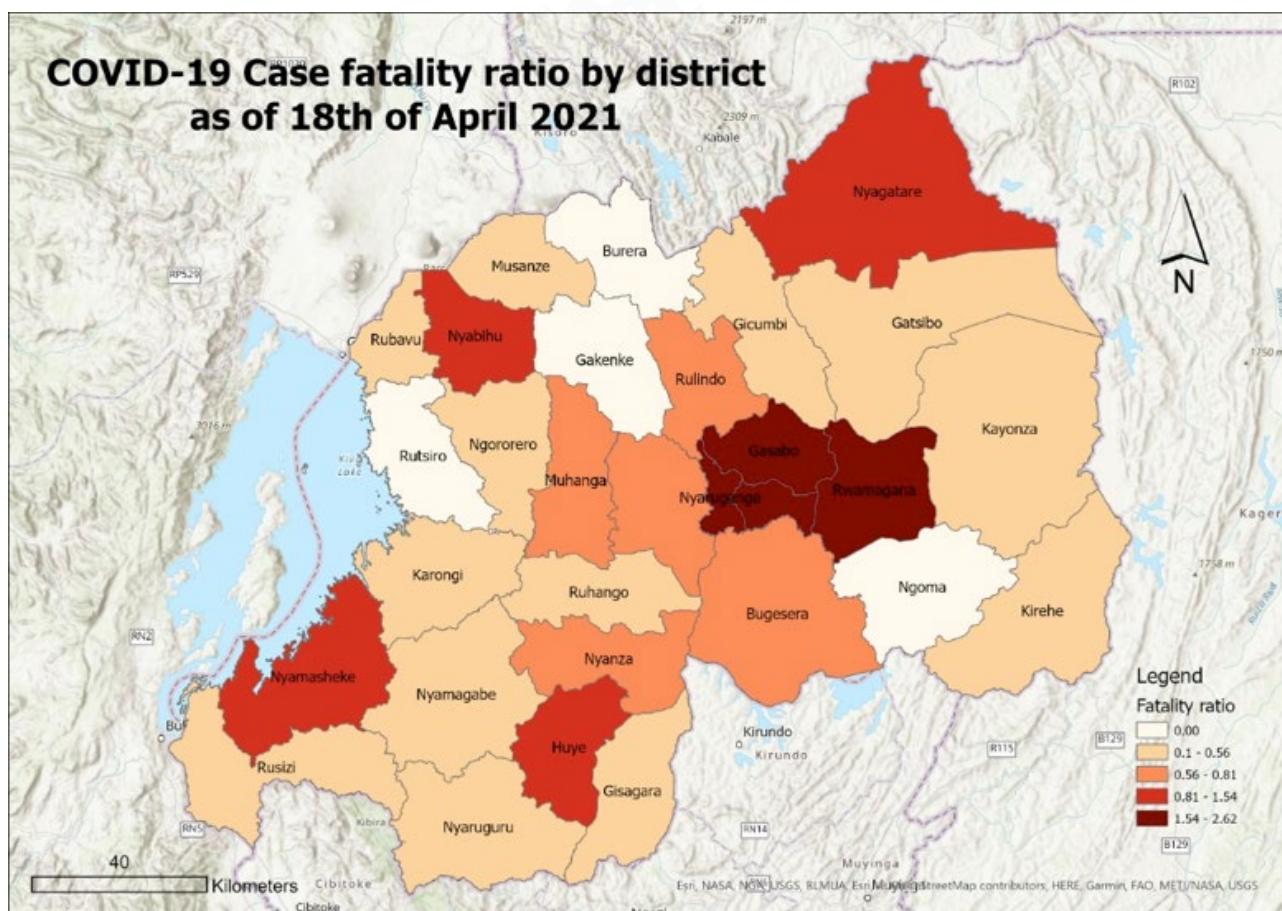
3. Weekly summary of numbers in comparison to the previous week

- 57 % (264) of all cases were reported from districts of Southern province, districts of City of Kigali accounted for 12% (56) while 31% (142) were reported by districts of other provinces.

5. Highlight of the week

COVID-19 Preventive measure revision by the Cabinet:

Considering the epidemiological situation of COVID19 the Cabinet meeting of 14th April 2021 reviewed COVID-19 preventive measures, below are some of reviewed measures:

- Movements are prohibited between 9 PM and 4 AM, all businesses will close at 8PM
 - Movements between Kigali city and other provinces and between districts will continue
 - Movements are prohibited between 7 PM and 4 PM in 6 districts of Southern province: Ruhango, Nyanza , Huye , Gisagara, Nyaruguru, and Nyamagabe.
 - Physical meeting will continue not exceeding 30% of venue capacity and COVID-19 testing is required for meeting of more than 20 people.
- Private businesses will continue with essential staffs at no more than 50% capacity while other employees continue working from home on a rotational basis. Markets and malls will continue for essential vendors and must not exceed 50% of registered traders.
 - Restaurants and Cafés shall operate at 50% occupancy limit and will receive clients until 8PM
 - Citizen are reminded of the critical importance of complying with health measures including physical distancing wearing face masks and hand hygiene.
