










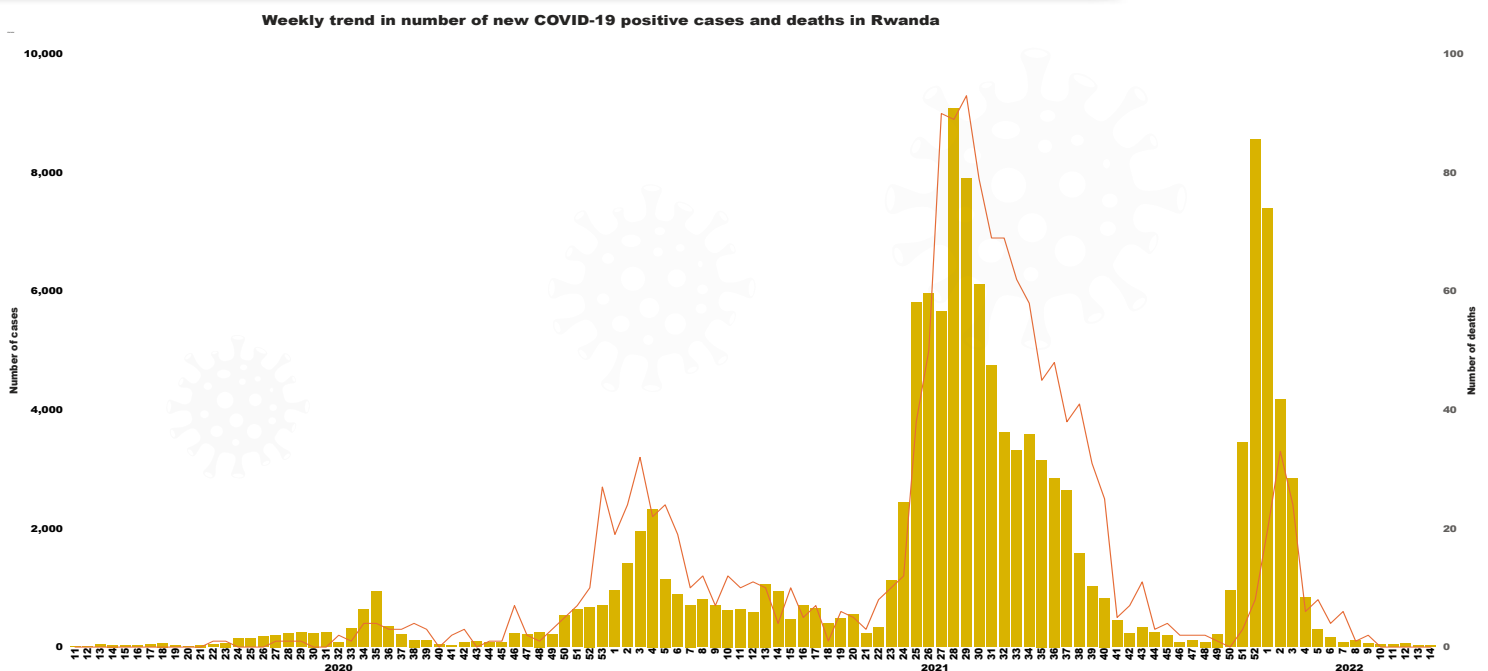

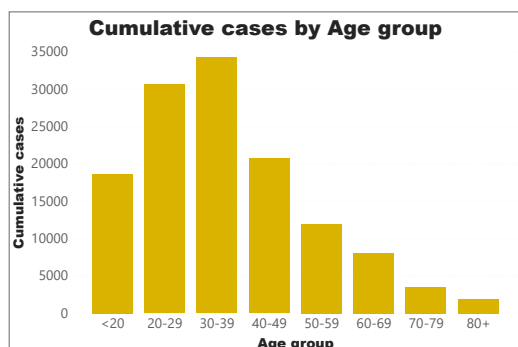

## 2. Weekly trend in number of new cases and deaths



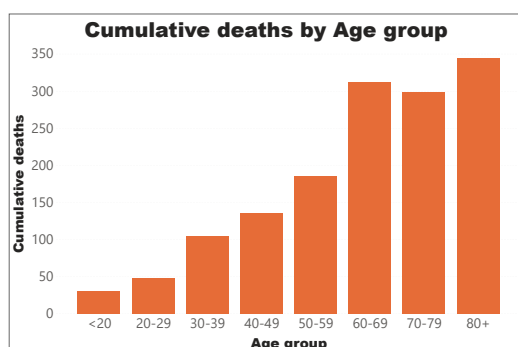
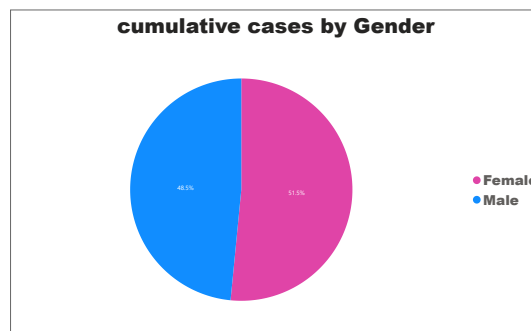
### 3. Distribution of cases and deaths by age group and gender.

Distribution of cases and deaths by age group and gender as of April 10 ,2022



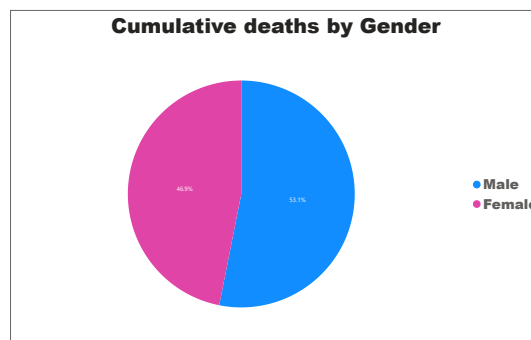

## 5. Highlight of the Week: Cabinet Resolutions on COVID-19 prevention

Considering the COVID-19 epidemiological situation, the Cabinet reviewed the existing COVID-19 Prevention measures. The following revised measures will take effect nationwide, starting on April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022. All other measures remain in effect and will be reviewed after one month upon a health assessment.

Citizens and Rwanda residents must be fully vaccinated to access public places. Fully vaccinated means having two doses, and a booster shot when eligible (administered 3 months after second dose). In addition, the public is urged to get frequently tested while continuing to observe preventive measures including properly wearing face masks and hand hygiene.

Arriving passengers at Kigali International Airport must present a negative Rapid test taken 72 hours prior to departure. An additional PCR test will be taken upon arrival, at own cost.

Departure passengers at Kigali International Airport must present a negative Rapid or PCR test (depending on requirement at destination) taken 72 hours prior to departure. All departing Rwandans must be vaccinated.

Public transport will continue with buses operating at full capacity and windows must be open for proper ventilation. Bus operators must ensure all passengers are vaccinated. Penalties will be applied for non-compliance.
