
TREND OF IDSR REPORTS COMPLETENESS

(Previous 10 weeks: Wk 50/2022 - Wk 07/2023)

Completeness - Wk 07/2023: 98%



Completeness is calculated as the proportion of received reports over expected reports by week in a catchment area

Observation: During this week 07/2023, the overall IDSR reports completeness was 98%. However, Ruhango Provincial Hospital had a low rate of completeness (between 60 and 79%), while others have the completeness >=80%. This hospital has to report all required reports.

Timeliness - Wk 07/2023: 95%



Timeliness is calculated as the proportion of received reports on time over the expected reports by week in a catchment area Observation: During this week 07/2023, the overall IDSR reports timeliness was 95%. However, some Hospitals had a low rate of timeliness (between 60% and 79%): Kabaya DH and Ruhango PH, while King Faysal hospital had a very low timeliness (below 60%). These hospitals have to report all required reports on time (on Monday before 12:00).















In week 07/2023, for 8 weekly reportable diseases, data analysis showed that Flu syndrome and Severe Pneumonia crossed the thresholds. Brucellosis and Trypanosomiasis had not any case to report. The distribution of flu syndrome cases in top 10 DHs showed that Kirehe DH had the highest number(2677cases), therefore some samples were collected and sent to NRL for testing in order to detect possible Influenza disease. Further investigation was needed for severe pneumonia.

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


Observation: During week 07/2023, the reported IDSR immediate reportable diseases were Bacterial Meningitis, Bloody diarrhea, Measles, Cholera, Typhoid fever and Severe malaria (they were suspected cases, except severe malaria which was confirmed).






TREND OF INCIDENCE RATE OF COVID-19








Observation: During the week 07/2023, The overall incidence rate of Rwanda was 0.1 case per 100,000 population. It was less than previous week (0.4 cases per 100,000 population in week 06) Kigali City, Rubavu and Gicumbi districts presented covid19 cases, while other districts did not have any case in week 07.

SUMMARY OF DEATHS REPORTED THROUGH e-IDSR (Wk 07/2023)



In week 07/2023, perinatal deaths had a highest number (51), especially in Rwamagana PH (6deaths), 15deaths of under 5 years, 3 maternal deaths. The audit should be conducted in health facilities for determining the cause of those deaths and elaborate recommendations for reducing those which should be preventable.

There were 19 events reported and verified in week 7,including 13 human deaths, in which 10 deaths were due to an incident occurred in Rugagi village, Rusororo Sector, Gasabo district, where the house for maize drying was accidently destroyed on 6th February 2023 and reported on 16th,2 dog bite (the persons were referred to the health facility and received vaccine) 2animal deaths and 2human illnesses.
